

GUSTORZYN GAS COMPRESSOR STATION

Description of the Investment Project

The Gustorzyn Gas Compressor Station is an important element of the planned expansion of the national transmission system. Due to the operating characteristics of the transmission system and the planned increase of gas supply volumes from the northern direction, the gas compressor station in Gustorzyn is an essential element of the Gas Interconnection Poland-Lithuania (GIPL) project and an important part of the Baltic Pipe project.

Advantages of the implementation of the project

The facility's role will be to enable the flow of gas volumes from, among other countries, Norway (Baltic Pipe) to the compressor station and then directing this stream towards, among others, Lithuania and other Baltic States (GIPL). Thanks to the construction of such facilities as the gas compressor station in Gustorzyn, GAZ-SYSTEM will be able to flexibly control gas flows and transport the fuel to customers throughout Poland as well as to neighbouring countries.

For the municipality where the compressor station will be built, the taxes to be paid annually by GAZ-SYSTEM in the amount of 2 per cent of the investment value will represent a major benefit.

Legal grounds

The project is implemented pursuant to the provisions of the Act of 24 April 2009 on Investments in Liquefied Natural Gas Regasification Terminal in winouj cie, Journal of Laws of 4 June 2009, as amended ("Special Act", Article 38(2)(h)).

Project of Common Interest

The European Commission granted the Project of Common Interest (PCI) status to the Gas Interconnection Poland-Lithuania (GIPL) and Baltic Pipe gas interconnection projects.

Financial support from the EU

The Gustorzyn Compressor Station, developed within the framework of the GIPL project, received funding from the EU Connecting Europe Facility (CEF), both for the engineering and construction works.

The Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) is the EU's key instrument for promoting growth, jobs and competitiveness and aims, among other things, to increase Europe's energy security.

Moreover, according to the ACER decision of 11 August 2014 on the cross-border allocation of project costs (CBCA), apart from the EU's financial support, the construction of the GIPL on the territory of Poland, including part of the infrastructure costs necessary to ensure full functionality of the interconnection, will be co-financed by the Transmission System Operators (TSOs) from the Baltic States, i.e. Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia.
